

2020 Summary

Well.... what a year its been for us all. None of us knew about COVID 19 this time last year. That said, God has been amazingly faithful with our Debt Centre and his provision through fundraising and one off gifts has led to an expansion in the form of a new Debt Coach, Emma Liberman, who joined the CAP Team in November 2020. We thank God that in a year where we have all felt challenged, God has abundantly blessed our Debt Centre and we give HIM all the thanks and the Glory. I am so pleased to highlight the key events and highlights of 2020.



4 Debt Free in 2020

How wonderful to report that 3 clients became debt free before we locked down in March, that is 3 clients living life with hope and a better future now that they are debt free. Thank You Lord,

Our 4th client has been with us over 2 years, and with a lot of hard work, we were able to make her debt free in October. She has now arranged her finances to pay all her bills by direct debit so that she avoids getting into debt in the future. Life has been and continues to be a struggle for her as her teenage daughter is in a home and of course its not been easy arranging visits during lockdown. However, she has hope for a better future.



CAP Angels

I want to thank you all for your prayers for funding. God's timing is always perfect. You all know that in the last two years we have been praying in **14 CAP Angels** (who donate £1k per year) to ensure our CAP Centre is sustainably funded in 2020 and beyond.

Well.... God brought our 13th CAP Angel forward on 3rd March, just before we had to close the church and all work from home. If that was not enough provision, He then opened the doors to our fundraising application which was approved a few months later and combined with a very generous one off gift from a church member, who knew of our vision to expand the capacity of our work, we were able to expand the Debt Work to allow another Debt Coach to be trained so that we can start to see more clients this year. We know that the demand for Debt help will increase at the end of the Government Furlough Scheme.

We also want to thank Stephen Maclean from Cricklewood Baptist Church for his support in allowing us in March to raise money and awareness of our local CAP Centre at the Scottish Ceilidh Event. On reflection, this was probably the last time people were allowed to meet in person with dancing, so I am glad that I for one, made the most of it!! We walk into the new year knowing that we are fully funded and can increase our help to those in our local community that need debt support. We pray that our Lord will walk in and touch every client, showing them HIS Love and breaking the chains of debt and poverty over their lives.

COVID 19 Impacts

Following the National lockdown, CAP National quickly sought approval from the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA), the Governing Body, to allow new clients to be seen remotely via telephone/online meetings and we moved all the processes online. There were only a few weeks where our service was temporarily suspended.

The result was that our diary remained full with a 2 month waiting list. In fact, we were able to see clients right up until 21st December 2020. Whilst our preferred client appointments are face to face either at a client's home or in the church, it was a relief to remain open for business during times of high levels of stress and anxiety, which was evident in both new and existing clients.

Within our Debt Centre, we also got to work using our CAP Befriender Team to provide emotional support though regular phone calls with existing clients and arranging food parcels where needed. Our befrienders were amazing at keeping the loneliness and isolation at bay for many clients. Thank you befrienders for all you give out to clients. May God continue to bless you all.

Fish and Chips Christmas Lunch



CAP Money

We have had such success moving CAP Money online, teaching people how to budget, spend, and save well. The first time we advertised online we really weren't sure of the response and its been a true blessing to see so many people attend, we have been able to reach people outside our local community.

It is a great success story. We develop the course content and God directed and prompted the delegates. A whopping 65 people have attended the course in 2020 and we ran 5 courses last year, more than previous years, we were conscious that people needed help managing tight budgets during the first lockdown with many fearful about losing their jobs.



We even had one delegate who joined from Dubai and another who joined in from Nigeria. Thank you Lord for helping us step out in this way. We now have two extra Money Coaches, fully trained and ready to support courses in 2021. The need is still great.


Kickstart - Handling Loss

In response to Covid-19, CAP produced a series of bite-sized videos on a range of topics including stress, anxiety and money. These are offered to churches as a resource to run independently for their communities

There was also a topic on Handling Loss and we decided this was a good Taster Topic to trial. We knew that a number of people in our church community had lost a loved one and needed a time to share, to grieve and to hear some practical ways of dealing with any type of loss in their lives i.e. loss of a job, loss of a friendship groups etc...



The course was well attended with 15 people taking part. The feedback was very positive and we have been able to signpost people to other organisations for additional help as well as promoting 'The Bereavement Journey – a 6 week course which is currently being run from Holy Sepulchre Church. We know a few people have signed up to be part of the course as a result of the Handling Loss session which was exactly the objective of the course.
