Prayer and Fasting for our Finances

We are really encouraged to see so many people back in church and to be able to reopen for more events, but we are still not quite back to normal and we have also needed to rely on our reserves and one off gifts to be able to maintain our church and ministries throughout the pandemic.

As we look to the future we are now wanting to do more and increase our impact once again but this will need funding financially. We want to be able to replenish our reserves and grow our budget to accommodate all that we believe God is calling us to do.

As well as replenishing our reserves we want to:

- complete a branding refresh and update our signage and website
- support eco projects in our grounds and expand their possible usage
- make the majority of our events free or at minimal cost for maximum inclusion
- · invest in our worship team with equipment and training
- grow our staff team once again to reach more and more people with the love of Christ
- prepare for possible church planting opportunities

The first step to achieving this is to come before our Heavenly Father who loves to give good gifts to his children and to earnestly pray. If he wants us to do all we believe he is calling us to do, he will certainly provide for us, but first we must humble ourselves and be reminded that we rely on him for every good and perfect thing. **To this end**- I would like to invite you all to join me in a day of fasting for our finances on Monday 15 November. We will have a zoom call 8-9pm in the evening to spend time in prayer together and share what the Lord has been speaking to us about as we have been praying throughout the day. The eco-group is currently working towards enabling St Gabriel's achieving Eco Church status. We would love to involve everyone at St Gabriel's in helping us to move forward with this and, especially in the Lifestyle section, there are steps that each of us can take.

Traditional incandescent light bulbs consume an excessive amount of electricity and must be replaced more often than their energy efficient alternatives. Halogen incandescent bulbs,

compact fluorescent lights (CFLs), and light-emitting diode bulbs (LEDs) use anywhere from 25-80 percent less electricity and last 3 to 25 times longer than traditional bulbs. Although energy efficient bulbs are more expensive off the shelf, their efficient energy use and longer lifetimes mean that they cost less in the long run.
